The Order exists to foster a unity of purpose and encourages engineers to honor their lifelong pledge.

NICE will host the next induction into the Order of the Engineer as part of the MS&T15 meeting. To be a part of this ceremony, fill out the application form on page 2 and mail it along with a check for \$25 to The American Ceramic Society. Be sure to provide your ring size (pinky finger of your working hand) as this will be ordered ahead of time for the induction ceremony. You have to have graduated from an accredited program to be initiated into the Order of the Engineer, so please fill that out on the form so we can verify it.
