**Background:** This last year was the fourth full year of the revitalized AACCS division (formerly the ACerS Art Division). The division focused on increasing visibility, and generating programmatic content focused on the application of the physical and sciences to the analysis of cultural objects made from glass, ceramic, and metal material. Membership is expected to be approximately 110 members by the end of August 2016, approximately the same as the previous year.

**ACTIVITIES:** The AACCS Division of the ACerS has undertaken the following items in 2015-2016:
